EARLY LITERACY TIP

Phonological Awareness

Children who can hear how words "come apart" into separate sounds will be more successful at "sounding out" words when they start to read. Knowing when two words rhyme, recognizing words that have the same beginning or ending sounds, and identifying syllables are all examples of phonological awareness.

Activities at home

Singing helps break down the sounds in words. The more you sing together the more your little one is learning. Try playing rhyming games! Encourage your little one to rhyme words.

LOOKING FOR QUALITY CHILDCARE

Finding childcare can be an intimidating task. There are many factors to consider, such as cost, location, hours of operation and your child's needs.

- Begin the search early. The best childcare providers fill up quickly, so it's important to start searching early. This allows plenty of time to compare options and find the right fit.
- Research is good. There are many different types of childcare available, including daycare centers, preschools and in-home childcare.
- Childcare can be expensive. It's important to factor in the cost when making your decision. Consider using a childcare subsidy program if you qualify.
- Consider the location of the childcare provider. Are they easy to get to in an emergency? Does the location change your regular commute?
- Visit and see for yourself. Once options are narrowed down, it's important to visit potential providers in-person.
- Trust your instincts. When going out to visit different providers, pay attention to your feelings as you go. If something feels uncomfortable during a visit, there is likely a reason, whether it is clear or not. Don't be afraid to move on until you feel confident in a decision.

- Healthychildren.org supports choosing a childcare center with a checklist, common questions to ask a childcare provider and additional resources.
