### **EARLY LITERACY TIP**

### Background Knowledge

Background knowledge is knowledge about



a particular subject. As children learn to read, the more background knowledge they have, the easier it is for them.

For example, if you are reading a story about dinosaurs, the more words you have heard about dinosaurs the easier it will be to comprehend texts. To help develop background knowledge, add vocabulary when you talk about a particular subject. Share your knowledge with your little one, and help build their background knowledge.

### **EARLY LITERACY TIP**

#### **Narrative Skills**

Narrative skills are the ability to describe the events, telling stories, knowing the order of events, and making predictions. To help build narrative skills try these activities:

- Ask open-ended questions that encourage conversations.
- Talk about your day and its series of events.
- Mix up the events in a story, make it silly.
- Guess what comes next-or come up with a different ending.
- Read stories without words; they help focus on narrative skills.
- Name objects, feelings, and events.
