EARLY LITERACY TIP: BUILD A HOME LIBRARY!



Creating a print rich environment in your home is one of many ways to get your young children ready

to start reading. Research shows that children who live in an environment where print materials are easily accessible and celebrated are more motivated to learn to read. One way to make your home a print rich environment is to build a home library with books that you and your children love to read together.

Books can be expensive but building your home library does not have to be, here are a few ways you can add books to your collection at little to no cost:

- Come to the library for our Summer Reading Program and pick up a free book for any child 0-18 years old.
- Enroll your 0-5 year old in the Imagination Library to receive a free highquality book in the mail once a month.
- Come to one of the library's Used Book Sales and take home some previously loved books for a fraction of the cost of new ones.
- Check the Little Free Libraries in your neighborhood for children's books.
- Plan a Book Swap with friends and neighbors to exchange reading materials.
