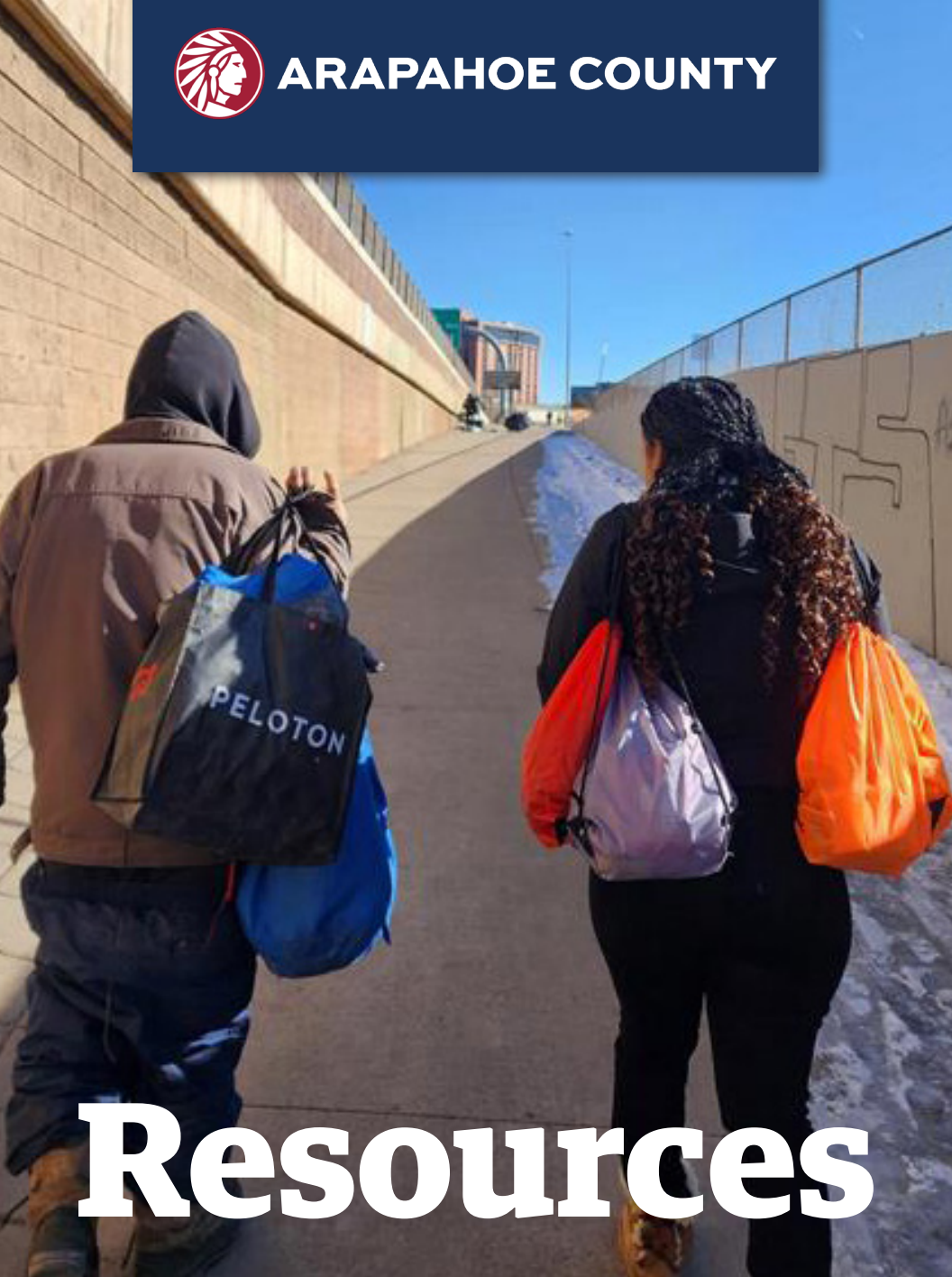

Operates October 1–April 30 only

Based on a referral from a partner organization they serve the following populations: Families with children under the age of 18, individuals with disabilities, individuals 65+ with age related disabilities, individuals who are pregnant, individuals with pets or service animals, transgender or gender non-conforming individuals, individuals recently released from a hospital.

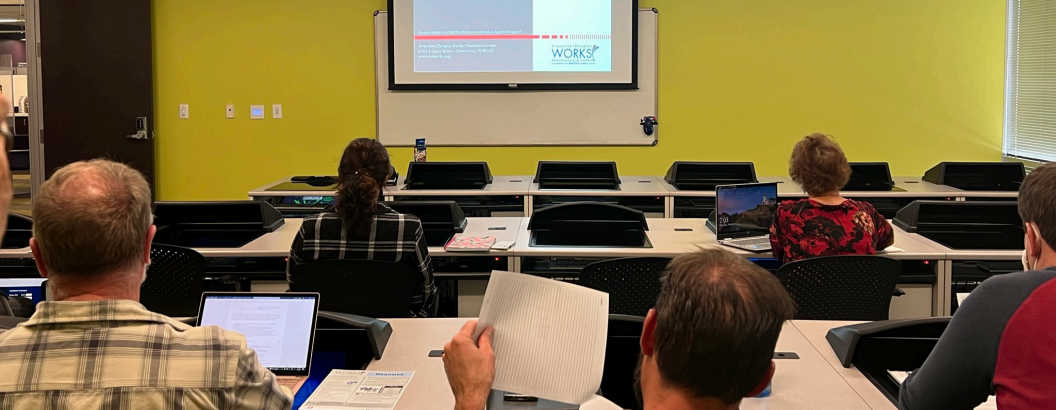
Aurora Day Resource Center

Offers housing assistance, employment services, financial literacy assistance, clothing, hygiene items, breakfast and lunch, dental, medical and behavioral health care services, job readiness training, and document retention. On-site computer lab, showers, laundry, sleeping bays, medication storage, and mail room.

Transportation to overnight shelters available 4–6 p.m.

Transportation from overnight shelters to Aurora Day Resource Center available 7–9 a.m.

Sun–Sat: 7:30 a.m.–5 p.m.

Aurora Cold Weather Outreach Team
