## Transit Options Across the Front Range

Check your city's website to see what types of fares, passes, and transit services are available where you live. Many cities offer youth discounts, zero-fare programs or seasonal free-ride options!

- **COLT (Loveland):** Zero-fare for youth residents
- **Transfort (Fort Collins & Larimer County):** Free to ride! Transfort also offers **FLEX**, connecting riders with stops between Fort Collins, Loveland, Berthoud, Longmont, and Boulder.
- **Greeley-Evans Transit (GET):** service in Weld County
- **Denver Connector:** Free, on-demand rides through mobile app
- **RTD (Regional Transportation District):** covers the greater Denver metro area, and includes buses, light-rail, and commuter line. Offers a Zero Fare for Youth program for riders 19 and under!
- **CDOT Bustang:** get into the mountains and back!

## Electric Bikes & Scooters

E-bikes and scooters are an easy, fun way to travel!

- Rent shared e-bikes & scooters from companies like **Spin** (Fort Collins), **Veo** (Denver), or **BCycle** (Boulder). Discounted rides are often available.
